Common Cold (Rhinovirus) Pediatric Fact Sheet

Information for Parents and Caregivers

What is Rhinovirus?

Rhinovirus is better known as the common cold; Most kids have 8-10 colds in their first 2 years of life, and often more if they are in daycare.

Symptoms of Rhinovirus

- Stuffy congested nose or runny nose
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Low grade fever (99-100.3 F)
- Sneezing

Cough

Is Rhinovirus Contagious? What is its Duration?

Rhinovirus is the most contagious during the first 2-3 days. The duration of Rhinovirus is usually 7 days, but some will have symptoms for 10-14 days.

Treatment & Symptom Management

Symptom management includes staying well hydrated and acetaminophen/ibuprofen as needed. Usually over the counter cough/cold medicines are not needed, NO antibiotics!

Prevention

The best prevention is to stay home when sick, covering cough and sneezes, hand hygiene, keeping up to date on well-child appointments and vaccines.

When Can a Sick Child Return to Day Care, School, and other Social Settings?

A sick child should be excluded from social settings until their symptom subside.
